CBSE Results: A Milestone of Achievement



Sharpening Minds, Shaping Futures – Orientation with Go Sharpener

An orientation session was organized by the Go Sharpener team for the students of Classes 3 to 8 on 24th April 2025. The session aimed to familiarize students with the Go Sharpener platform and its features, with a strong focus on sustainable actions and the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The program began with an introduction to the platform, where students were guided on how to post their sustainable actions and take part in challenges related to environmental issues like pollution. A video was screened to explain the 17 SDGs announced by the United Nations in 2015, which aim at solving global problems such as poverty, inequality and climate change. Students were also informed about India's current global SDG rank (109) and were encouraged to contribute actively through the platform to help improve it by adopting collective sustainable practices.

The team then explained the platform's features, which allow students to post their sustainable actions such as planting trees, reducing plastic use, or saving energy, while also earning points and certificates for their efforts. They were shown how creative hashtags like #ChiefAnimalOfficer. to use #WellnessChamp and #ArtistAndCreator to categorize their posts. The session also highlighted the reward system, where students can redeem their points for unique opportunities such as visits to Radio FM offices and biodiversity parks. Towards the end of the session, students were provided with their login credentials and guided step by step on how to download the app, log in and begin posting their actions. The orientation proved to be highly engaging and informative, motivating students to take small yet impactful steps toward sustainability while also making learning about SDGs exciting and rewarding.



Awards were presented to the best performing delegates from each committee, recognizing their outstanding research, articulate presentations, diplomacy, and leadership during the proceedings. With overwhelming participation, insightful debates, and tireless efforts by the secretariat and the organizing team, SGS INTRAMUN 2025 concluded on a high note.

Career Counselling Workshop: Guiding Futures with Clarity

A Career Counselling Workshop was organized on 17th July 2025 for the students of Classes XI and XII. The session was conducted by Mr. Shubham Kumar and Mr. Bhavneet, experienced faculty members at QA-LRDI, who guided students about career opportunities and competitive exams.

Mr. Shubham opened the session by highlighting that ages 16–17 are a crucial stage to make informed career choices. He emphasized that the 2026 Board Examinations would be a landmark year for Class XII students, as they would face both board exams and entrance exams, the latter being decisive for entry into top colleges. He spoke about the importance of competitive exams in ensuring fair admissions to prestigious institutes, citing IPMAT launched by IIM Indore in 2011, offering a dual BBA+MBA degree. He shared how graduates from such programs secure lucrative placements, sometimes exceeding ₹1 crore, and listed career avenues after MBA such as Business Analyst, Marketing Manager, Investment Banker, Product Manager, Strategy Consultant, Operations Manager, and Financial Analyst. He also introduced CLAT, its acceptance by 24 NLUs, and the strong placement opportunities in the legal field.

Taking over, Mr. Bhavneet familiarized students with international opportunities, discussing Ivy League universities and reputed institutions in the UK, Europe, and the USA, including Imperial College, University of Bath, Bristol, MIT, and Harvard. He explained the SAT exam structure, scoring pattern, and its importance in admissions abroad. The workshop concluded with a vote of thanks, leaving students better informed about diverse career paths and the preparation required to achieve them.






Dreams of Tomorrow - Kavya Nagar, XI-B


