Cardholders enjoy 10% off OPD consultations, 20% off OPD investigations, 10% off OPD pharmacy, 20% off health check-up packages, and 10% off IPD services.

This collaboration reflects the school's holistic approach to education, prioritizing not only academic growth but also the physical well-being of its community. By integrating regular health monitoring and accessible medical support, St. George's School ensures a safe, healthy, and nurturing environment for students, families, and staff alike.

The initiative strengthens the school's vision of fostering overall development, highlighting the importance of health as a foundation for learning, growth, and lifelong wellness.



## *Prepared Today, Safe Tomorrow – Disaster Management Workshop*

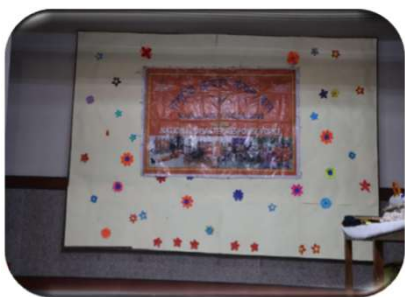


A Disaster Management Workshop was held at St. George's School on 20th November 2025 for students of Classes 7 and 8. Organised by the NDRF (National Disaster Response Force) under the guidance of the DDMA (District Disaster Management Authority), the session was led by Inspector B.S. Chauhan and his expert team.

The workshop aimed to raise awareness about different types of disasters and equip students with essential skills to respond effectively in emergencies. Key techniques, including earthquake drills, identifying emergency exits, and basic safety measures, were demonstrated. Students also learned to manage common injuries such as bleeding and fractures, along with vital life-saving skills like CPR and mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.

Interactive mock drills engaged students actively, giving them practical experience in the earthquake safety position—Drop, Cover, and Hold—and safe methods to assist injured persons. Many students participated on stage, which enhanced their understanding of safety protocols and boosted their confidence in handling emergencies.

The session concluded with Inspector Chauhan emphasizing the importance of staying alert, prepared, and spreading awareness about disaster safety within the community. The workshop was informative, engaging, and highly beneficial, leaving students better equipped with life-saving skills and the knowledge to respond calmly and effectively during unforeseen emergencies.

## Celebrating Spirit and Stamina: Annual Primary Athletic Meet

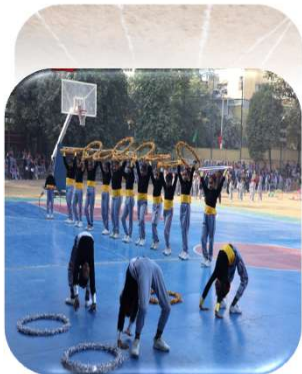
