- **Modern-styled Air-Conditioned Reception:** The new Reception is ergonomically designed and its layout is hospitable. It is adorned with a giant display unit showcasing the various prestigious awards and accolades won by our competent students across various competitions. 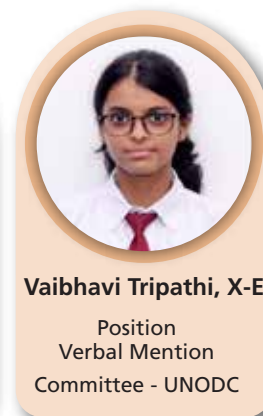
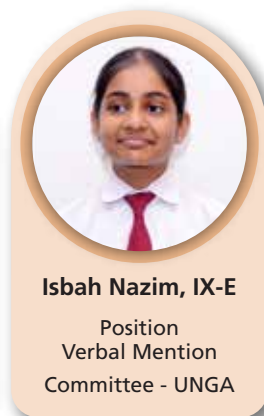
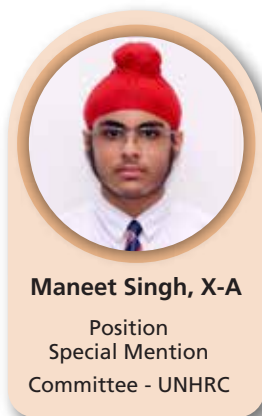
